WAYNE MARSHALL studied organ with Derek Cantrell and piano with Gordon Fergus-Thompson whilst attending Chetham's School of Music in Manchester. He held the post of Organ Scholar at Manchester Cathedral in 1977-79 and in 1978 won a scholarship to the Royal College of Music where he is at present studying with Nicholas Danby and Angus Morrisson. In September 1980 he was appointed Organ Scholar at St. George's Chapel, Windsor Castle. In March this year Wayne toured in the USA, and he has recently returned from a three recital tour of Yugoslavia.

JONATHAN WALKER has for the past five years been a chorister at St. Paul's Cathedral, and has spent the last 12 months as Head Chorister. He has sung many solo roles in concerts throughout the country, and has sung amongst other works the Ripieno part in Bach's St. Matthew Passion, the Messiah, and Britten's Curlew River with the Cambridge Opera Group.

NIGEL STORK and ROBERT GOODE are both members of the choir. Nigel has sung in many concerts locally, including the lead part in the opera Spider Monkey Uncle King, written for Cookham Festival in 1970. Robert is well known locally as a soloist, and has sung all the major tenor oratorio roles, including Messiah, Elijah, St. John Passion, and the Creation.

THE CANTORUM CHOIR was formed in October 1981 from singers living in the Thames Valley area, and has a maximum of 20 voices. Its conductor, Jonathan Miall, is himself a bass/baritone, and is studying with Arthur Reckless, Professor of Singing at the Guildhall School of Music. The choir has performed carols in Cookham Dean, a major concert programme in Marlow, and madrigals and part-songs on

the River Thames, and this concert represents the fourth this season. The choir intends to develop a very wide repertoire, producing chamber performances of many of the significant choral works, together with performances of some lesser known pieces.
