Cantorum Choir was founded by Jonathan Miall in 1981 with just 4 singers. Since then it has grown to its present size of 30, accumulating a broad repertoire, giving concerts throughout the Thames Valley and further afield, and making recordings. The next concert, Kodaly's Missa Brevis and Rossini's Petite Messe Chonelle will take place on 15th October 1994.

Murray Hipkin, making his first appearance as conductor of Cantorum at this concert, went to Desborough School, Laidenhead, and York University before pursuing a professional musical career. He has worked extensively as coach and répétiteur at the English National Opera, and has played with Opera Factory, the London Symphony Orchestra and the London Philonietta. Murray is currently Musical Director of Opera Brava, which this year embarks upon a tour which will include La Cheme, Don Pasquale and The Marriage of Figaro.

Cantorum Choir is delighted to share this concert with the Teachers Chamber Choir of the Pedagogical Secondary School in Grodno, Belarus, and their conductor, Anna Sriha. Their programme will include a selection of folk music typical of their Slavonic tradition. During their short stay in England, members of Cantorum Choir are hoping to introduce their guests to a taste of the English way of life. Their week will include concerts at High Wycombe Abbey School and St James's Picadilly, sightseeing in Windsor and Oxford and a visit to a traditional English pub!
