The Cantorium Choir has been in existence since 1981 and, in that time, has undertaken well over 50 concerts and other musical engagements including weekend commitments at the Cathedrals of Guildford, Winchester and St. George's Chapel, participation in a recording of carols with the Westminster Cathedral Choir, television appearances in "Inspector Morse" and "At home with Wendy Craig" and co-production concerts with the Alexandra Choir in the Royal Albert Hall.

The choir has established a very high reputation for quality concerts, both small and large scale, and has developed a substantial following in the Thames Valley.

Maggie Davis

Maggie Davis lives in Maidenhead with her husband and four children. At college, she studied singing under Moring Noble as well as Cello and Conducting and for many years she has been working as a freelance conductor and director with many societies in Berkshire and Buckinghamshire. Her productions cover all types of music from Gilbert & Sullivan, through operettas to Grand Opera, plus numerous American Musicals. (One highlight was "La Bohème" with Park Opera.) Until recently, Maggie sang with the Pro Musica Chorus of London.

At present, Maggie works at home as a private singing teacher and as a peripatetic voice teacher at Sir William Borlase's school in Marlow. Earlier this year, she was conductor and organiser of a Buckinghamshire County project involving 2,000 children performing for 3 nights at the Swan Theatre, High Wycombe. The final item involved more than 200 children on stage! Her other projects this year, as well as conducting Cantorium Choir, are musical director for Wycombe Savoy's productions of "Trial by Jury" and "H.M.S. Pinafore" and directing "South Pacific" for Bourne End Operatic Society.
