CANTORUM CHOIR

The Cantorum Choir is one of the finest amateur choirs in the Thames Valley area, having built up its reputation through regular concerts for the past 18 years. It draws its membership from experienced musicians and numbers at least 24 singers, presenting on average four concerts a year.

Since its formation in 1981, the choir has been involved in numerous engagements further afield, including a broadcast for BBC TV, soundtrack for the *Inspector Morse* series, an appearance on BBC 2's *Out and About*, recordings for Pickwick and Silva Screen Records, and guest appearances at carol concerts at the Royal Albert Hall.

Last year the choir undertook its first overseas tour to Paris, with highly acclaimed performances at Messiaen's church La Trinité and at Meaux Cathedral.

The choir is most fortunate in having three fine conductors, in Jonathan Miall (its founder and president), Murray Hipkin, of English National Opera, and today's conductor, Sally Stafford.

SALLY STAFFORD - Conductor

Sally began her musical career by playing the oboe. She read music at Royal Holloway College, where she studied conducting as part of her degree course. She has been Head of Music at Burnham Grammar School, teacher and conductor at the Wycombe Music Centre, and County Advisory Music Teacher for Buckinghamshire, during which time she wrote "Sound Activities", a book on teaching music in primary schools. In 1989 she was appointed Director of Music at Dame Alice Owen's School, where she conducted a full symphony orchestra, a training orchestra of 130, a chamber orchestra, jazz bands and choirs. She has conducted orchestras on the South Bank and was invited to demonstrate music teaching on the platform of the Royal Festival Hall, as part of the Festival of Music for Youth.

She has taken a great interest in the training and supervision of music teachers and has lectured on the P.G.C.E., B.Ed. and M.A. courses at Middlesex University. Sally has recently devoted her time to bringing up her young family, and is now beginning to resume her professional career in conducting and in music education, through teaching and consultancy work.

KERI DEXTER - Organist

Keri Dexter read music at Clare College, Cambridge, where he was an organ scholar, and at the University of Reading; he is currently studying for a Ph.D. in musicology at Royal Holloway. Whilst at Cambridge, Keri appeared with Clare College Choir on numerous broadcasts and recordings, as both singer and organist. He also performed in major festivals in Europe and the USA. During this time, he was a pupil of David Sanger and of Stephen Farr, with whom he continues to study.

An accomplished baritone, Keri has been a member of the *Cantorium Choir* since 1995. He has also sung with the choirs of St Martin-in-the-Fields, Sheffield and Southwark Cathedrals, and St George's Chapel, Windsor.

GORDON COLLINS - Pianist

Gordon Collins started piano lessons at the age of five and later, whilst at Grammar School in Birmingham, studied the clarinet and cello. In 1952 he won first prize at the Cheltenham Open Piano Competition. From 1959 to 1984 he studied privately with Professor Patrick Cory of the Royal Academy of Music.

Gordon particularly enjoys piano accompaniment and chamber music but is also an experienced conductor, both of instrumentalists and vocalists.
