ALEXANDRA & CHARLOTTE REID



A Great Hampden resident from birth, **Alexandra Reid** attended Wycombe High School before going on to read Music at Selwyn College, Cambridge. She graduated in June 2006 with a first class honours degree in Music.

Alexandra was a member of the National Youth Orchestra of Great Britain for five years, being appointed leader for its 2004 season. Last year she gained a place in the European Union Youth Orchestra, with whom she toured Europe and the Far East in July and August.

Alexandra has been taught by Peter

Hanson and Sophie Langdon. A few weeks ago, she graduated with distinction from the Royal Academy of Music where she has just completed her final year as a postgraduate under Erich Gruenberg. During her time at the Academy she led the Academy Concert Orchestra, was a member of the Royal Academy Soloists, and in her final year was appointed Project Manager of the Leverhulme Orchestral Mentoring Scheme.

Charlotte Reid attended Wycombe High School and has recently completed her second year at the Royal Academy of Music. Having been awarded a scholarship to the Academy, she was also awarded the Sir John Barbirolli prize and the Franz Rezenstein prize last summer.

Charlotte was a member of the National Children's Orchestra for four years and leader in her last year. In 2006 she completed her fifth and final year with the National Youth Orchestra of Great Britain, having been accepted as the year's youngest violinist in 2002. She was appointed leader for both its 2005 and 2006 seasons, during which time she also led the NYO Sinfonietta in a Chamber Prom at Cadogan Hall.

Charlotte has performed under Sir Simon Rattle and Sir Colin Davis at the BBC Proms. She was taught for 8 years by Peter Hanson and is now studying with Marianne Thorsen at the RAM.



Inspiring Voices ~ Giving Pleasure Cookham's Chamber Choir

CONDUCTOR'S NOTES



Drawing inspiration from its most recent tour, Cantorum Choir offers a programme of Venetian church music, focusing in particular on the work of **Antonio Vivaldi**.

Vivaldi was known to his contemporaries principally as a performer. Today, of course, we see him as a composer, whose greatest legacy is perhaps to be found in his five hundred or more concertos, over half of which were written for the violin. Cantorum is delighted to be able to welcome back **Charlotte** and **Alexandra Reid**, who will perform the **Concerto for Two Violins in A Minor** (op.3

no.8) taken from *L'Estro Armonico*, a collection of twelve works originally published in 1711 and still recognized as one of the major milestones in the development of the concerto form.

Vivaldi's obvious affinity with the violin remains evident in his choral writing, particularly in the psalm settings heard this evening. In both the *Laetatus Sum* and *Laudate Dominum*, the principal melodic material is entrusted to an elaborate violin *obbligato*, whilst the chorus offers a finely balanced homophonic declamation. The virtuosity of the concertos combines with the strong influence of Venetian operatic writing in tonight's larger scale works, notably the *Kyrie* and the *Magnificat*.

If Vivaldi's principal commitment to music in Venice was through the Ospedale della Pietà (the foundation for illegitimate children, renowned for its female orchestra and choir, where Vivaldi was "Maestro de' Concerti"), the other composers featured in tonight's performance were more readily associated with the majestic musical establishment at the cathedral of St. Mark. It remains uncertain whether Giovanni Gabrieli's Jubilate Deo was intended for a church service or written for performance at one of the city's vast outdoor festivals. The lush eight-part contrapuntal writing contrasts starkly, however, with the more modern sounding 'stile concertato' of Claudio Monteverdi's Beatus Vir. Here, solo voices are pitted against the weight of the chorus, and vocal and instrumental contrasts are fully explored, as Cantorum are once again joined by the violinists Alexandra and Charlotte Reid.
